Sure, Spain's capital city is loaded with culture. There are art museums, historic monuments and squares and churches everywhere.

But they weren't top of my list. On a two-day break there was one place I just had to visit — Madrid's Santiago Bernabeu Stadium.

Home to the European champions, the undisputed glamour side of Europe (sorry Killie), even if you're only remotely interested in football, the stadium tour is a must-do on a trip there.

We had flown into the city on an early-morning flight from Edinburgh and after a state of the biggest football club in the world — Real Madrid.

20-minute bus ride into the city centre we found our hotel — the Only You Hotel Atocha — traight across from the main chromal codo start. And it got even better. The Only You Hotel is listed as a lawys with a smile.

course, San Miguel. The market was reopened in we wandered over to the Plaza Mayor, a large impressive square and another tourist hotspot.

The Plaza saw a few public executions during the Spanish Inquisition but these days it's an exclusive residential area with a ring of old and traditional shops. short walk from there is Puerta del Sol, one of the busiest places in Madrid. Surrounded by all the big shop names, it's a large square featured every year on Spanish TV for the New Year celebrations.

We wandered up to the famous Prado Museum, only ten minutes from the hotel and Spain's main art museum, considered one of the best in the world.

A good 20-minute walk will also get you to the Plaza Mayor while the magnificent monument to King Alfonso XII in Buen Retiro Parque is even closer. All these places are also on the city bus tour's historic route.

What costs what? A two-course lunch for two with drinks costs between 30 and 50 euros use the bus service from the air port terminal into Madrid Don't forget to drink plenty water — it's hot in summer

wanted to see on the modern route though – the Bernabeu.
You can opt for the guided tour but we felt the 25 euro do-as-you-like deal was the best

idea.

You start from near the top of the breathtaking stands and work your way down through the work your way down through the stadium to pitchside and the dugouts and on down into the dressing rooms where some of the most expensive players in the world have been.

There's a stunning display of those 12 European Cup and Champions League traphics

those 12 European Cup and Champions League trophies they've won and there's plenty of stuff in there about the club's star players, past and present.

After all that we were ready for a quick lunch then we headed back to our favourite hotel for a coffee in the ground floor bakery before taking a well-earned siesta. siesta.
